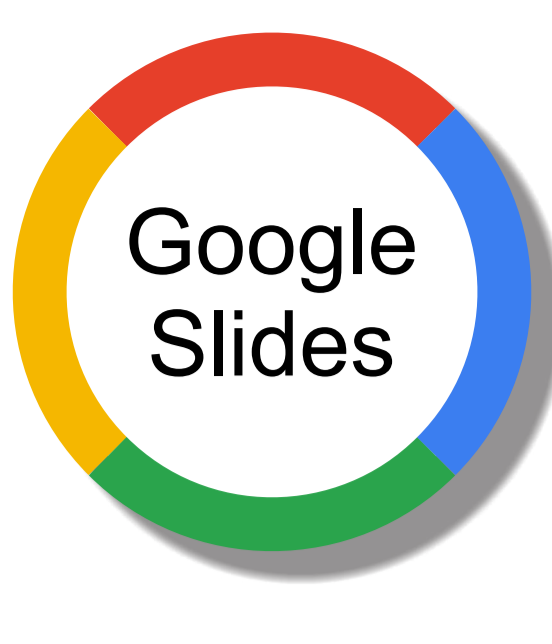


Crosswords 2

ANIMALS

ACROSS

SHAPES

ACROSS

COLORS

ACROSS

- 1 The colour between green and orange in the spectrum, a primary subtractive colour complementary to blue; coloured like ripe lemons or egg yolks.

- 3 The colour between blue and yellow in the spectrum; coloured like grass or emeralds.
- 4 A colour intermediate between green and violet, as of the sky or sea on a sunny day.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

ACROSS

- 1 A member of a family of metal wind instruments with a reed like that of a clarinet, used especially in jazz and dance music.
- 2 A stringed musical instrument, with a fretted fingerboard, typically inclined sides, and six or twelve strings, played by plucking or strumming with the fingers or a plectrum.
- 3 A percussion instrument sounded by being struck with sticks or the hands, typically cylindrical, barrel-shaped, or bowl-shaped, with a taut membrane over one or both ends.
- 4 A large keyboard musical instrument with a wooden case enclosing a soundboard and metal strings, which are struck by hammers when the keys are depressed.
- 5 A large brass wind instrument with straight tubing in three sections, ending in a bell over the player's left shoulder, different fundamental notes being made using a forward-pointing extendable slide.

- 1 A musical instrument played by striking a row of wooden bars of graduated length with one or more small wooden or plastic beaters.
- 2 A stringed musical instrument of treble pitch, played with a horsehair bow.
- 3 A musical instrument consisting of a frame supporting a graduated series of parallel strings, played by plucking with the fingers.
- 4 A musical instrument played by stretching and squeezing a membrane that blows air over metal reeds, the melodeon.
- 5 A brass musical instrument with a flared bell and instrument has the tubing looped to form a straight line.

SPORTS

ACROSS

- 1 Athletics (track-and-field) sport of throwing a spear for distance, included in the ancient Greek Olympic Games as one of five events of the pentathlon competition.
- 2 A form of football played by two teams of eleven players with a round ball which may not be handled during play except by the goalkeepers.
- 3 A game played between two teams of five players in which goals are scored by throwing a ball through a netted hoop fixed at each end of the court.

SPACE

ACROSS

- 1 The fourth planet from the Sun and the second-smallest planet in the Solar System, being larger than only Mercury.
- 2 The fifth planet from the Sun and the largest in the Solar System. It is a gas giant with a mass one-thousandth that of the Sun, but two and a half times that of all the other planets in the Solar System combined.
- 3 A modular habitable artificial satellite in low Earth orbit. It is a multinational collaborative project involving five participating space agencies.
- 4 The sixth planet from the Sun and the second-largest in the Solar System, after Jupiter. It is a gas giant with an average radius of about nine times that of Earth. It only has one-eighth the average density of Earth; however, with its larger volume, it is over 95 times more massive.
- 5 The second planet from the Sun. It is named after the Roman goddess of love and beauty. As the brightest natural object in Earth's night sky after the Moon, it can cast shadows and can be, on rare occasion, visible to the naked eye in broad daylight.
- 6 Earth's only proper natural satellite. At one-quarter the diameter of Earth, it is the largest natural satellite in the Solar System relative to the size of its planet, and the fifth largest satellite in the Solar System overall.

DOWN

- 1 The seventh planet from the Sun. Its name is a reference to the Greek god of the sky who, according to Greek mythology, was the grandfather of Zeus and father of Cronus. It has the third-largest planetary radius and fourth-largest planetary mass in the Solar System.
- 2 The eighth planet from the Sun, located in the Kuiper Belt, a ring of bodies of icy volatiles beyond the gas giants. It was the first and the largest to be discovered.
- 3 The ninth planet from the Sun in the Solar System. It is the fourth-largest planet in the Solar System, the Sun takes 87.97 Earth days, the shortest of the gas giants in the Solar System.
- 4 The eighth and farthest planet from the Sun in the Solar System. It is the fourth-largest planet in the Solar System, the massive planet, and the most distant from the Sun.
- 5 The third planet from the Sun and the only one known to harbor life.
- 6 The star at the center of the Solar System. It is a nearly perfect sphere of hot plasma, held together by its own gravity and nuclear fusion reactions in its core.
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
