

Indefinite article



LEVEL 2
19 Boom cards

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Is it 'a' or is it 'an'? Which is the correct indefinite article to use and when?

Use 'a' when the next word begins with a consonant and use 'an' when the next word begins with a vowel.

This is level 2 in a series of BOOM decks that explore the indefinite article and explains how/when to use it in a sentence.

Level 1:

Drag the 'A' or 'An' into place to make the sentence correct. Includes visual guides to help select the correct response

Level 2:

Same as level 1 but with no visual guides to assist

Level 3:

Click on the correct words to make the sentence correct.

Level 4:

Type in either 'a' or 'an', and on some cards also select the correct word, to make the sentence correct.

The rules for when to use A or An in a sentence:

If the next word begins with a CONSONANT, use A.

If the next word begins with a VOWEL, use An.
